

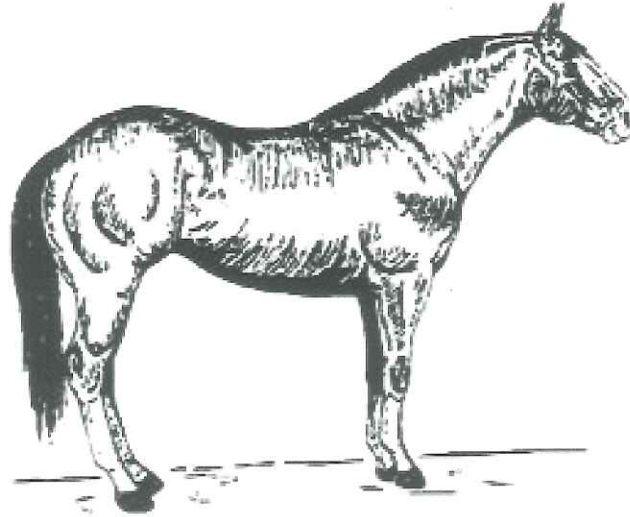

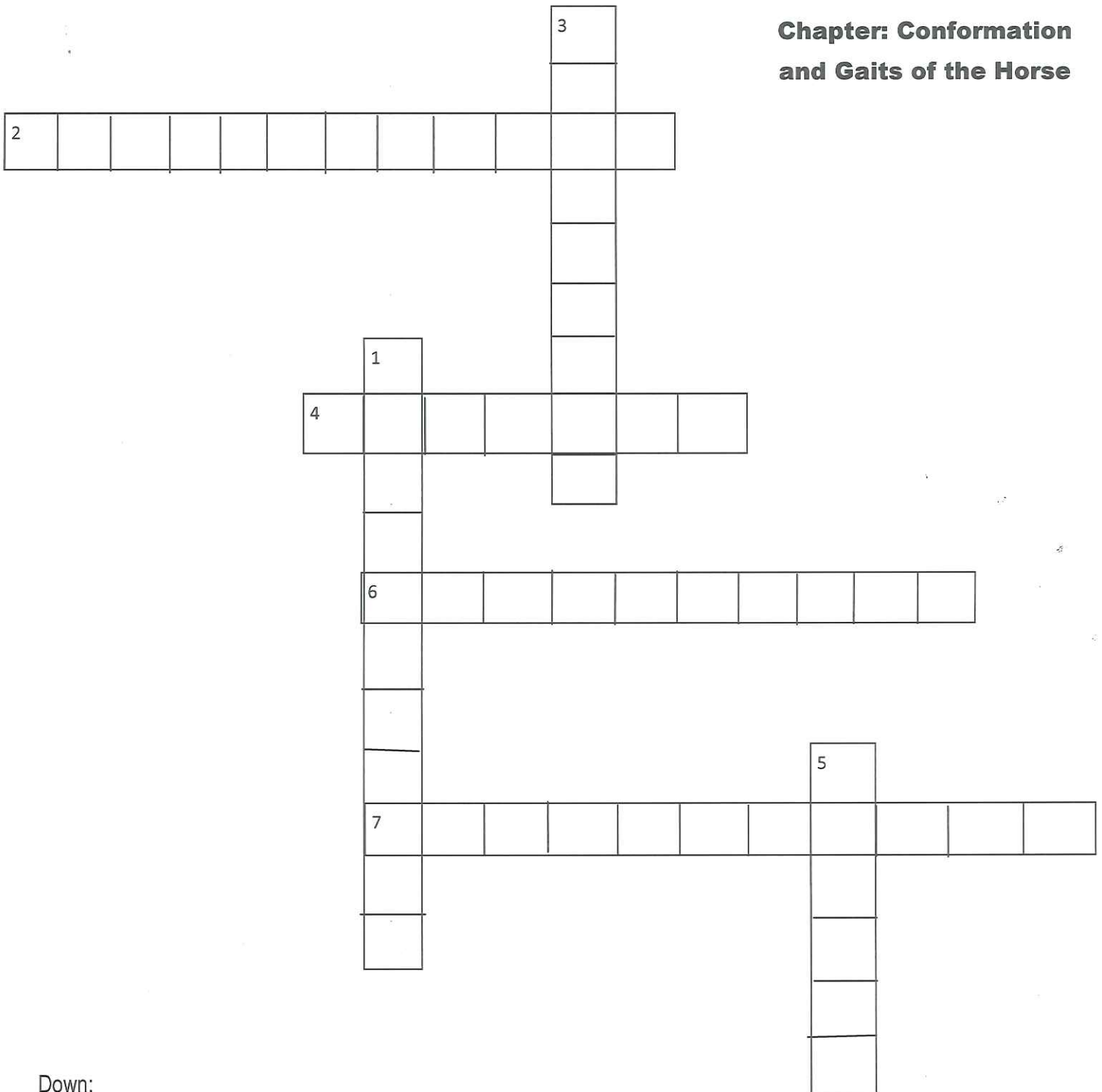

## Chapter: Conformation and Gaits of the Horse



Down:

1. A twisting of the striding leg around the supporting leg, such that the hooves land in a straight line.
3. An inward swing of the hoof as the foot moves forward. Most common in splay-footed horses.
5. A short, quick, choppy stride. This tends to occur in horses with short, upright pasterns.

Across:

2. The rear foot hits or steps on any part of the front foot, other than the sole.
4. Striking the underside of the forefoot with the toe of the hind foot, generally seen at the trot.
6. Throwing the front feet outward as the foot moves forward. Most common in pigeon-toed horses.
7. The striking of any part of a supporting leg by a leg in motion.
