Dear 4-H Llama Members,

All 4-H Llama/Alpaca enrollments must be completed online at <https://v2.4honline.com> by **May 15** in order for you to exhibit at the Hancock County Fair and/or the Indiana State Fair. Please refer to the instruction sheet on the website on how to enroll your llamas/alpacas online in the 4-H data system. Step-by-step online instructions and a Llama Lease Agreement (if needed) are posted at <https://extension.purdue.edu/Hancock/pages/article.aspx?intItemID=24887>. Please read the ownership rules carefully in the 4-H Handbook. The online enrollment must be completed by 11:59 pm on **May 15** or you will be unable to exhibit.

4-H members must upload a minimum of 1 color photo of each animal with a maximum of 4 photos. The color photo, singly or together, **must show the animal's face and all four legs and be of sufficient quality**. 4-H Members that lease animals for exhibition are required to provide the name of the leasor and their contact information at the time of animal enrollment for each leased animal. Please have the pictures and lease information ready when enrolling online. Copies of lease forms need to be on file in the Hancock County Extension Office by May 15.

Failure to enroll online by May 15 will make you ineligible to exhibit in 2021. All 4-Hers should print out and bring a copy of the email you receive from the enrollment website confirming enrollment to check in. If you run into any issues, please let our office know so that we can assist you **well in advance** of May 15. Our office is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m and May 15th is a Saturday this year. Any questions, please call our office ASAP.

Completing 4-H Animal ID online is not the equivalent of entering 4-H Animal Shows at the Indiana State Fair. **A separate online entry is required for Indiana State Fair exhibition.
