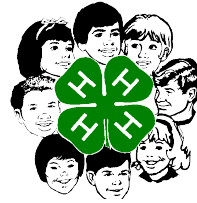

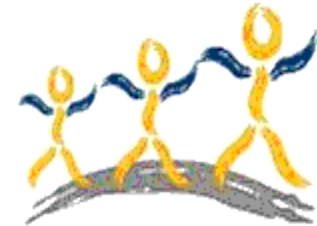

Future 4-H is for youth enrolled in first and second grades as of January 1 of the 4-H program year.
