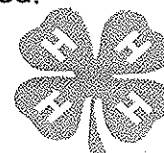


Keeping 4-H Costs Low

- Don't create something new for 4-H. Many school projects can double with 4-H projects.
- Use digital photos for the photography project. Only print the ones you will use.
- Reuse the back of an old poster for the next year. Poster sleeves help to keep posters in good shape.
- Pair up with another family to purchase supplies. Sometimes, things like craft or sewing supplies could be shared.
- Utilize public libraries for computer use.
- If you want to participate in an animal project but don't have the animal, look into doing a poster project for that species.
- Use recycled materials when possible.
- Participate in projects where YOU are the exhibit such as action demonstrations, public speaking, or Junior Leaders*.
- Attend camps and workshops—most are available at little or no cost to all families in Randolph County.
- Plan ahead all year and catch sales on the items you will need.
