

# Consumer Clothing

## Project/Notebook Requirements

**Advanced:** You may stay in this project division for three years, grades 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>. Each year you will add a section to your notebook, based on the garments you have purchased and the activities you have completed. New record sheets will be given to you each year that you are in the project, but you will receive only one project manual.

## Exhibit Requirements

- Complete a notebook. (40%)
- Purchase a total outfit, containing any number of garments. Shoes and accessories are included, but do not have to be new purchases. (30%)
- Model garments in the "Consumer Clothing Fashion Revue." (30%)

\* An outfit is a garment or garments that when put together make a complete look, and the young person is ready to go out the door – such as a one or two piece dress, a one or two piece pant suit, or a three piece combination, such as pants, vest, and blouse or shirt. An example of something that is **not** an outfit would be pants and a jacket without buttons – would need to make a shirt to go under the jacket, also.

## Notebook

Add information to the three ring binder you began in the earlier divisions of this project. If this is your first time in this project, get a three ring binder and decorate it any way that you would like. The notebook will be judged based on the following:

- Title page
  - Include your name, address, and age
  - Project name and division (Intermediate)
- Consumer Clothing Purchase Record page.
- Information Gathered Sheet – use one sheet for each of the garments purchased.
- Photograph – Photographs for the Advanced division should show the 4-H'er wearing the outfit accessorized in different ways. One photo will need to be included showing the outfit as it will be modeled. At least two additional pictures should be included showing different accessories that change the "mood" of the outfit – from dressy to more casual, for example.
- Complete one activity from each group in the manual. Describe what you did for each activity, and the results or findings. Write about each on a separate page, label by group number and letter, as they are in the manual. For example, Activity Group 1-A. Each year you will select other activities from each group.
- Complete the Consumer Clothing Summary form and include it in your notebook. Answer each of the questions completely so that the judge will understand why you made the purchases you did, and what you learned in the project.

Please leave these pages in your notebook. Next year you will add pages and build a record of your accomplishments in this project. Please put the most recent year completed in the front of the notebook.



*The Consumer Clothing Record Sheet (4-H 751) goes in your green Record Book and must be signed by your 4-H Leader.*
