

Leather Craft Project Requirements

Arts and Crafts State Fair Project

Up to 12 Arts and Crafts exhibits from the Marion County Fair can be advanced to the State Fair as follows: Up to two exhibits from Fine Arts, two exhibits from Needle Craft, two exhibits from Model Craft, and up to six exhibits from Any Other Crafts.

Requirements for All Classes and Exhibits at the Marion County Fair:

1. Exhibit
2. Attach to each project the 4-H 618a-W 4-H Craft Information

For all arts and crafts exhibits:

Cloverbud: Gr. K-2

Level 1: Gr. 3-5

Level 2: Gr. 6-8

Level 3: Gr. 9 and up

Article must be ready to use. Attach 4-H 618a-W 4-H Craft Information card.

General suggestions: Suede type leather is not suitable for being stamped or carved. Articles made of rough, unfinished suede type leather (i. e. tepee kits) should be entered in miscellaneous crafts. Do not use tape to attach exhibit tag or craft card as it can harm the finish on a leather item.

Exhibit requirements:

Cloverbud: One article that you have stamped. Cloverbuds do not have to attach the craft information card.

Level 1: One article with a simple design that you have stamped. Apply brown or black dye or appropriate finish. Exhibit should use two or three designs.

Level 2: One article or set of coordinating articles more difficult than the one(s) exhibited in Level 1. Apply appropriate finish.

Level 3: One article or set of coordinating articles more difficult than the one(s) exhibited in Level 2. Apply appropriate finish.
