

# Pottery Project Requirements

## Arts and Crafts

### State Fair Project

Up to 12 Arts and Crafts exhibits from the Marion County Fair can be advanced to the State Fair as follows: Up to two exhibits from Fine Arts, two exhibits from Needle Craft, two exhibits from Model Craft, and up to six exhibits from Any Other Crafts.

#### **Requirements for All Classes and Exhibits at the Marion County Fair:**

1. Exhibit
2. Attach to each project the 4-H 618a-W 4-H Craft Information Card

#### **For all arts and crafts exhibits:**

Cloverbud: Gr. K-2

Level 1: Gr. 3-5

Level 2: Gr. 6-8

Level 3: Gr. 9 and up

4-H'ers may submit up to one exhibit in each pottery category. Attach 4-H 618a-W 4-H Craft Information Card to the project. Items must be fired in a kiln before exhibited. Non-fired items will not be judged and will receive a participation ribbon. Please note that many schools/classes call wheel thrown and hand built pieces "ceramics", but in 4-H these items are called pottery.

#### **Categories:**

**Hand Molded-** Example: slab work, coil work, pinch pot

**Cloverbud:** One hand molded article from moist clay with appropriate finish. Cloverbuds do not have to complete a craft card.

**Level 1:** One hand molded article from moist clay with appropriate finish.

**Level 2:** One hand molded article from moist clay with appropriate finish.

**Level 3:** One hand molded article or set of articles with appropriate finish.

#### **Wheel Thrown (using a pottery wheel)**

**Cloverbud:** One wheel thrown article from moist clay with appropriate finish. Cloverbuds do not have to complete a craft card.

**Level 1:** One wheel thrown article from moist clay with appropriate finish.

**Level 2:** One wheel thrown article from moist clay with appropriate finish.

**Level 3:** One wheel thrown article or set of articles with appropriate finish.
