Important Dates:

- 2 Saturday's prior to Fair will be Fancy Banding, for all Exhibition animals. (excluding Turkey's) 7am-3pm at the Poultry barn. Skills check off will also be offered at this time as well as a showmanship clinic.
- The Saturday prior to the fair will be weigh in for Roasters, Broilers, Duck and Goose, any animal that will be for commercial classes, not Turkey's. 7am -12pm at the Poultry barn. Skills check off will also be offered at this time, as well as a showmanship clinic.
- All Turkey's exhibition or commercial will be brought to the fair the Thursday night prior to the start of the first Friday of the Fair. Turkey's will be weighed in from 10am-9pm.
- All Poultry being exhibited will be brought in the Thursday prior to the first Friday of the Fair 10am-9pm.
- Barn Set up will be the Monday prior to the first day of Fair. This will also be the July Meeting. (Will not be the 2nd Monday of the month like typical mtgs).
- Birds must be removed from the Barn on the last Friday of the Fair by 530pm. All paperwork must be turned into the Leader by this time.

Times will be enforced. There will not be any reminder calls placed that day for weigh in or banding. Please put these dates on your calendar.

Club Rules:

- 1. Club Dues are \$20.00 and are to be paid by the April Meeting. There will be a \$1.00 late fee for each month they are late. 10 year members will have this fee waved as a gift from the club.
- 2. All birds being purchased for the commercial auctions, (roasters, broilers, turkeys, ducks or geese) that will be exhibited must be purchased from the club on a designated date, and same birds exhibited.
- 3. All birds except commercial classes are to be in your possession as of April 1 of current year.
- 4. Members must register birds at the June meeting in order to exhibit birds. There will be no changes in birds registered after the July meeting unless to delete from exhibition.
- 5. Feed Records will need to be completed and turned in by the July Meeting.
- 6. Birds are to be brought to the fair Thursday night prior to the start of fair 10am-9pm
- 7. It is the responsibility of the 4H member to feed the birds every day, twice daily. If you cannot feed twice in one day you must make arrangements with another family.
- 8. All birds to be exhibited must meet States Health Requirements. Any birds showing signs of illness/disease or parasites will be sent home. All birds will be Pullorum Tested by a certified tester at a predetermined date.
- 9. All poultry coops, feeding cups, feed and watering system will be furnished by the club while the birds are at the fair.
- 10. There will only be one entry (single, or pair) per class.
- 11. Classes identified starting with a letter (A100) are local classes only and are not eligible for state fair.
- 12. Exhibitors must be present for judging and auction of their birds in Show Attire. Show Attire is as follows, no exceptions: Blue Jeans with no holes, Poultry Shirt tucked in, tennis shoes, or show boots. If this show attire is not worn you will not be allowed to show or auction. Again, absolutely no shorts or holes in the jeans. No hats or lanyards are to be worn while at the show table, or at the auction table.
- 13. The 4Her will be responsible for getting the bird to the show table. If necessary to have help, make prior arrangements with another 4Her. There will be adults in the back to help get the birds out of the cage. No parents are allowed in the cage areas during show. If birds are not on show table after two calls, they will be scratched from exhibition.

- 14. All birds to be auctioned must be of commercial weight. Birds will be weighed on a certified scale provided by the poultry club. Weights will be as follows: Roasters 6-10 lbs, Broilers 3# 8 oz-5 lbs, Hen Turkeys: 13-25 lbs, Tom Turkeys: 20-45 lbs, Pekin Ducks: 8-10 lbs; Embden Goose: 10-20 lbs. Weigh in shall occur the Saturday prior to the start of the fair, except for turkeys which will be weighed in on Thursday evening prior to the start of fair.
- 15. Each exhibitor may auction two transactions. *This is to be reported to the leader no later than noon on Monday before the auction.* The exhibitor must initial the auction slip and check off what they will be auctioning. If an exhibitor has not initialed the paperwork by noon Monday of the fair that exhibitor will not be allowed to auction on Friday.
- 16. Birds will be removed from the Poultry Barn from 2:00pm-5:30pm and final paperwork done on the last Friday of the fair. There will be no checking out until this time unless other arrangements have been made prior to this date. Leadership of the club will not be responsible for any birds in the barn after 5:30pm.
- 17. All 4Hers should arrive for Barn Clean Up on the last Saturday of the Fair at 7:00am.
- 18. Exhibitors should not take birds back to their home flocks unless the birds are isolated for two weeks and recommend putting 7-dust on them so you don't bring home parasites into the flock.
- 19. If an exhibitor decides that he/she does not want to exhibit but they would like to complete in 4H Poultry club they have the following options:
 - a. You will complete an essay on what you have learned in your 4H career and what skills you have learned to help you in your future. You will also need to complete the Skills check off. Because there is no project to see at the fair, you will not get a fair pass for the season, but you will complete your year in 4H.
 - b. You will be required to complete a poster to display in the ECCC. There are two categories. You will need to ask leadership for the requirements of this project. You will also be required to complete the skills check off with this option. Since you will have a poster on display, you will receive a pass for the season.
- 20. The Poultry Club Leaders and Advisory Board will rule on any special situations arising and this decision will be final.

4H Commercial Chicken Classes
