

# Woodcraft Project Requirements

## Arts and Crafts State Fair Project

Up to 12 Arts and Crafts exhibits from the Marion County Fair can be advanced to the State Fair as follows: Up to two exhibits from Fine Arts, two exhibits from Needle Craft, two exhibits from Model Craft, and up to six exhibits from Any Other Crafts.

### **Requirements for All Classes and Exhibits at the Marion County Fair:**

1. Exhibit
2. Attach to each project the 4-H 618a-W 4-H Craft Information **This information card is for ALL Arts and Craft exhibits** even if it is not listed under the project.

### **For all arts and crafts exhibits:**

Level 1: Gr. 3-5

Level 2: Gr. 6-8

Level 3: Gr. 9 and up

Classes: Level 1 - Level 2 - Level 3

## **Woodcraft: Exhibit Requirements**

The woodcraft project is designed to help 4-H'ers learn and practice a variety of wood finishing techniques. If the 4-H member is interested in developing wood construction skills, the member should enroll in 4-H wood science (woodworking) **Item must be ready to use.**

Attach to the exhibit the new 4-H 618a-W Craft Information Card.

**Level 1:** One small unfinished article of wood to which a finish has been applied. Examples of articles: box, picture frame, cut-out puzzle, candleholders, etc. Degree of difficulty should be increased as 4-H member advances through the levels.

**Level 2:** One small unfinished article of wood to which a finish has been applied. Examples of articles: box, picture frame, cut-out puzzle, candleholders, etc, with a design applied with paint, watercolors, chip carving, colored pencils, or wood burning. An Appropriate finish is to be applied. Degree of difficulty should be increased as 4-H member advances through the levels.

**Level 3:** One unfinished article of wood to which a finish has been applied. Examples of articles: box, picture frame, cut-out puzzle, candleholders, etc, using one of the above skills or inlay, gouging, carving, wood chipping, or wood burning. Degree of difficulty should be increased as 4-H member advances through the levels.
