Sheep and Goat Webinar to be held on Thursday, February 15

Purdue University and Kentucky State University (KSU) will hold a FREE webinar for sheep and goat producers on Thursday, February 15 from 7:00 – 9:00 pm EST (6 – 8PM CST). The theme of the program is animal health and the three bad “C’s” – 1) Coccidia; 2) Caseous Lymphadenitis; and 3) Caprine Arthritis Encephalitis.

Dr. Jessie Lay, DVM and Assistant Professor at KSU will discuss Coccidia symptoms and treatments. Dr. Beth C Johnson, DVM with Kentucky Department of Agriculture will discuss Caseous Lymphadenitis – an economically important disease and how to prevent and control. Dr. Johnson will also discuss Caprine Arthritis Encephalitis and how to diagnose, prevent and control within your herd.
