

Model Building Project Requirements

Arts and Crafts State Fair Project

Up to 12 Arts and Crafts exhibits from the Marion County Fair can be advanced to the State Fair as follows: Up to two exhibits from Fine Arts, two exhibits from Needle Craft, two exhibits from Model Craft, and up to six exhibits from Any Other Crafts.

Requirements for All Classes and Exhibits at the Marion County Fair:

1. Exhibit
2. Attach to each project the 4-H 618a-W 4-H Craft Information
3. Instructions for model kit

For all arts and crafts exhibits:

Level 1: Gr. 3-5

Level 2: Gr. 6-8

Level 3: Gr. 9 and up

Classes: Level 1 - Level 2 - Level 3

Model Building: Exhibit Requirements

There are up to two State Fair entries selected from all models at the County Fair. These may be from any division (Level 1, Level 2, and Level 3).

4-Hers may enter in a maximum of two different classes.

Exhibits must be on a display base and covered. Attach to the exhibit the new 4-H 618a-W Craft Information Card. All models must be assembled using model glue or model cement.

(Small-scale replica (no die casts) Lego built models go in Lego Project. Suggestion: Place model on piece of heavy cardboard a little larger than the model in all directions. Stretch clear plastic wrap over the model and tape to bottom of cardboard. The judge will remove the plastic wrap during judging. There is no guarantee that the same wrap will be used to re-cover your exhibit. However, exhibits will be re-covered. Another good display method is the use of a clear hard plastic shoebox. Please list your division and section on your nametag. Display/project size limit is 3' x 3'. If the model is being built from a kit, include a copy of the instructions with the craft information card.

Level 1 Classes

Section A: Painted Models: the exterior of the model must be painted; the interior is optional.

Section B: Unpainted Models Using Pre-Colored Plastic Parts: Trim or decorative painting is optional.

Section C: Theme Category: A theme scene with model or models - Single models only with scene needs to be exhibited in Section B

Level 2 Classes

Section A: Individual Models Painted: the exterior of the model must be painted - the interior is optional.

Section B: Individual Models Unpainted.

Section C: Theme Category: A theme scene with model or models - Single models only with no scene need to be exhibited in Section A or B.

Level 3 Classes: All parts must be painted, including interior, exterior, frame, engine, differential, etc. Section A: Individual Models: single models with no scenes only.

Section B: Theme Category: A theme scene with model or models. Single models with no scene need to be exhibited in Section A.
