Rules and Regulations

1. Any resident of Wabash County or member of a Wabash County Extension Homemaker Club may exhibit items that he or she has made.
2. Any article previously exhibited at this fair is ineligible for exhibit again. Food preservation entries must be from the past year. All other entries must have been made within the last two years.
3. Each exhibitor may enter two exhibits in each category.
4. Entry fee is \$1 per exhibit.
5. Recognition will be given for Blue, Red, and White placing in each category. Champion and Reserve Champion recognition will be given in each category, if warranted. Grand Champions will be selected in each Division.
6. Each exhibit must be labeled with the exhibitor's name and category according to exhibit list. Entry labels will be available at check-in. No exhibit will be accepted without a proper label.
7. Care is taken to protect all articles exhibited, but we cannot be held liable for loss or damage of exhibits.
8. All exhibits must remain in place until released Friday, July 19 from 7-9 p.m. **No Saturday pick-up.**
9. Any person may enter their projects in the Open Class at the State Fair by **completing the proper forms by July 1 and submitting to Purdue Extension Wabash County.** Exhibiting and winning at the Wabash County Fair is not a requirement. These forms are available at the Wabash County Purdue Extension Office, or on-line at the Extension website.
10. Professionals whose main source of income in a particular category are prohibited from exhibiting in that category.

Division I Foods:

Categories: Include recipe on a 3" x 5" card for each submitted item. Use paper plates for all baked exhibits, except cakes and pastries. Cover with plastic wrap.

1. Cookies- Bar, drop, rolled or pressed (6)
2. Pastries - Fruit or nut pie in foil pan (1 whole) One or two crusts.
3. Cakes - Square, oblong, or round layer cake with frosting of your choice. (1 whole)
4. Cupcakes with frosting of your choice (3)
5. Quick Breads- a. Muffins (3)
b. Nut or Fruit Bread (1 whole)
6. Yeast Bread –Choice of:
a. Dinner rolls (4)
b. Loaf bread (1/2),
c. Fancy yeast (1/2 or 4 rolls)
7. Snacks - One package or jar of an invented snack
8. Candy – Your choice, fudge, divinity, etc. (6 pcs.)

Division II Food Preservation:

Categories: Include recipe on a 3" x 5" card for each submitted item. Preserved products should be in a clear glass container suitable for product. Exhibit only one (1) jar with name of product, month, year and method of processing. Leave band on jar.

1. Jams or Jellies
2. Canned Fruits
3. Canned Vegetables & Salsa
4. Canned Pickles
5. Dried fruit, vegetables, or herbs (1 jar or package)

Division III Needlecrafts & Sewing:

All pictures must be framed and prepared for hanging or will receive one placing lower.

Categories:

1. Needlepoint
2. Cross-stitch
3. Crochet or knitting
4. Crewel or embroidery
5. Quilting – all hand work
6. Quilting – any machine work
7. Sewing wearable garments
8. Sewing non-wearable and accessories

Division IV Arts & Crafts:

Categories:

1. Basketry
2. Woodworking
3. Scrap Booking
4. Jewelry
5. Do Your Own Thing
6. Recycled Items – made from recycled materials (size limit 3ft. x 3 ft.)

Division V Fine Arts & Photography:

All pictures must be framed and prepared for hanging or will receive one placing lower.

Categories:

1. Oil, acrylic, watercolor
2. Charcoal, pastels, pencil, ink
3. Photography

Division VI Horticulture:

Categories:

1. Floral arrangement of fresh flowers or herbs
2. Single specimen - perennial, annual, herbs
3. Wreaths - dried or fresh
4. Edible arrangements (vegetables, fruits, herbs or combination)
