## Improve the use of de-worming products on your farm by learning the FAMACHA® technique.

FAMACHA® is a diagnostic tool to help sheep and goats producers identify animals that require worming treatment from those that do not. This helps to reduce products resistance and assists in the decision process of removing under-performance animals from the flock/herd.

The tool is a color coded card used to match the eyelid color to and determine the anemia levels of the animals. Anemia is an indicator of *barber pole worm* infection. The use is limited to the parasites which cause anemia, however, it is important and useful tool for producers to incorporate as part of their flock/herd management practices.
