General Rules

Items will be entered from 8:30 am to 11:30 am, Monday, July 15th at the Red Barn at the Fairgrounds.

Judging will start at 12:30 pm.

Release time for all exhibits in the Red Barn:

Friday, July 19th from 8:30 pm-9:30 pm

Saturday, July 20th from 9:00 am to 11:00 am

GENERAL RULES

Any Franklin County resident or parent of a Franklin County 4-H member may enter, except 4-H members.

Any item for entry must have been made or finished by the exhibitor since last year's fair and not shown at a previous Franklin County Fair.

All exhibits must be entered on Monday from 8:30 am to 11:30 am. For those who work and find it difficult to make entries during regular hours, an earlier entry period will be made available if requested in writing to the Red Barn Committee in care of the Purdue Extension Office before July 1st. Late entries will not be accepted.

Entry tags may be picked up prior to the fair at the Extension Office.

Each exhibit will receive a ribbon. A champion will be chosen in each class unless the judge decides one is not warranted. An Overall Grand Champion will be chosen from each Category. A premium of \$1.00 will be given for each class champion.

The committee is not responsible for exhibit, however; all precautions will be taken and the building will be locked after closing.

Judges decisions will be FINAL. Avoid disqualifications by following schedules carefully.

Both men and women are encouraged to enter.

No advertising or for sale notices may be placed with exhibits.

Any exhibits not picked up during the designated times will be discarded after we have tried to contact the exhibitor.

Any premiums or ribbons not claimed within two weeks after the fair will be forfeited.

ALL WALL HANGINGS, PICTURES, ETC, MUST BE DISPLAYED READY TO HANG.

FLOWER SHOW Category

Arrangements must be the work of the exhibitor. Flowers must be grown by the exhibitor. No florist flowers or greenery allowed. **CUT SPECIMENS SHOULD NOT HAVE ANY FOLIAGE BELOW THE WATER LINE!**

Exhibitors may exhibit 3 entries in a class, but each entry must be a different color.

Only natural flower colors are to be used. No exhibits with paint, food colors, artificial flowers, etc. will be accepted.

Entries must have a considerable stem and foliage on stem.

Flowers must be displayed in unlabeled, clean, unprinted clear, glass or plastic bottle, furnished by the exhibitor. Failure to do so will result in one ribbon grade lower.

Exhibit must be displayed on Styrofoam, cardboard, aluminum, or a plastic plate

Organically grown food is food grown using no synthetic fertilizers or pesticides.

FOODS Category

For food competitions: filling, frosting, glazing, pie filling, and meringue, (whether cooked or uncooked) are not permitted to contain cream cheese, sour cream, heavy cream, or whipped cream as the nature of these products increases the moisture content and water activity can be ideal growing conditions for 4 food borne pathogens, *even if the ingredients is part of a batter and baked.*

Additionally raw milk, raw milk products or uncooked eggs/egg whites are not permitted. Eggs/ egg whites that have been cooked to 160 F (i.e. pasteurized or included as part of a batter or baked) are acceptable. No home-canned fruits, vegetables, or meats are permitted in products. Recipes must be provided that show which ingredients were used in each part of the product. Contestants should carefully wash their hands and make sure that their hands do not have any open cuts before preparing foods. Contestants should not be preparing food exhibits for competition within 48 hours of recovering from any illness. Whenever possible, baked products should be transported and stored in chilled coolers (41F).

Judges and individuals who will consume product from county and state competitions should be informed that they are at risk for food borne illness since the established policy cannot guarantee that an entry which may be a “potentially hazardous food” has been properly prepared or handled before, during or following the competition,. Tasting of a food product is solely at the discretion of the judge. Judges are NOT to taste any low-acid or acidified preserved food, like green beans or tomato products, and are discouraged from tasting any other home preserved food.

PLEASE **DO NOT** EXHIBIT FOOD ITEMS ON PAPER PLATES (use Styrofoam, cardboard, aluminum, or plastic). Entry must be covered with plastic wrap or be enclosed in a zip type bag. Items will be sold after judging unless indicated by the exhibitor.
