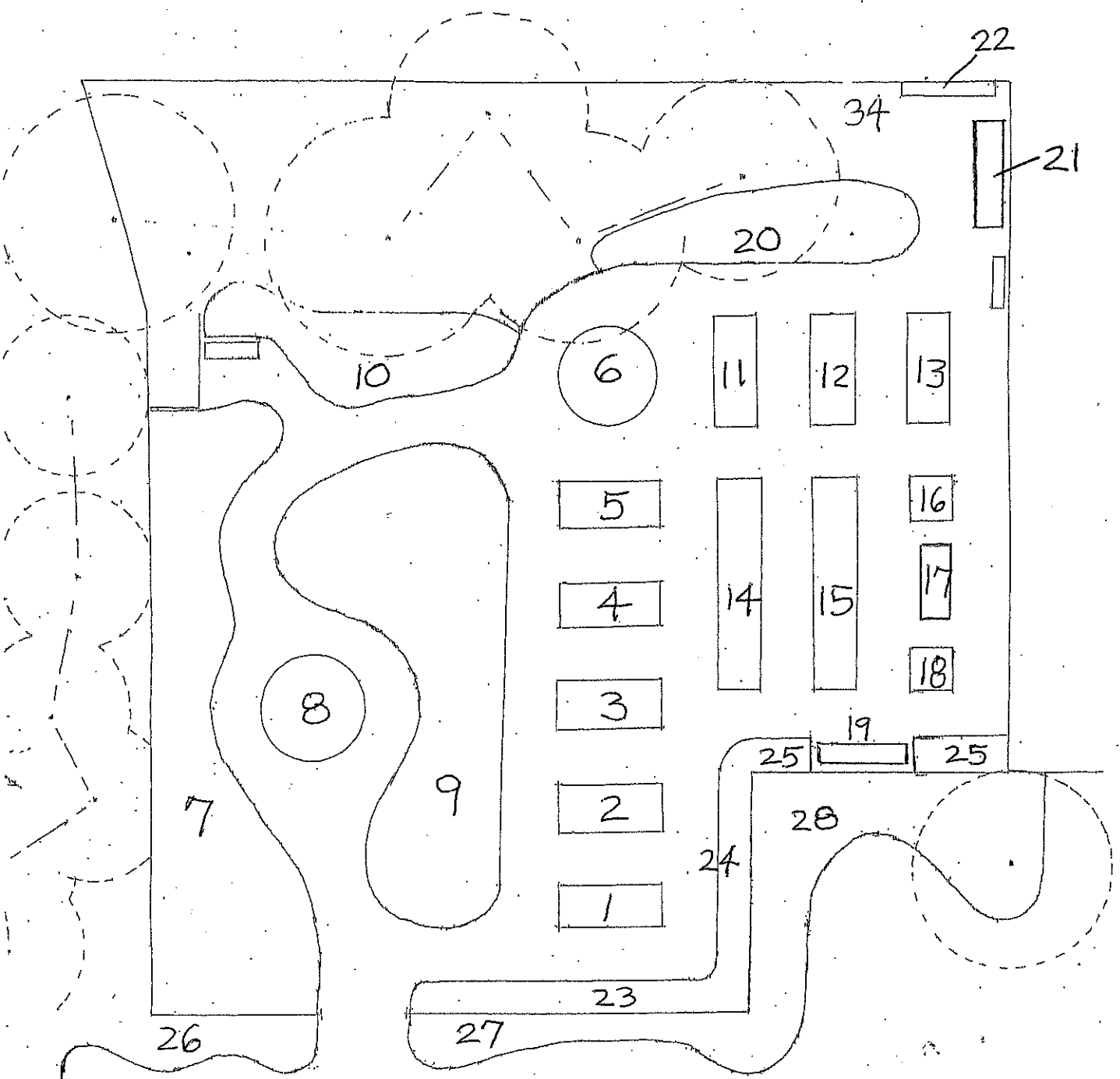

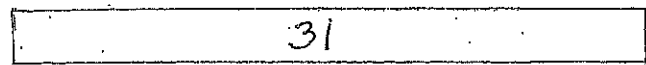

The VegTrug elevated garden bed (Gardener's Supply Company, <http://www.gardeners.com/>) was donated by the Marion County Master Gardener Association. The 2' x 8' Elevated Cedar Planter Box (Gardener's Supply Company, <http://www.gardeners.com/>) was donated by the Garfield Park Master Gardener Association. The three Garden Towers were donated by Garden Tower Project (<https://gardentowerproject.com/>).

The vertical wall garden was patterned after a design from the Chicago Botanic Garden (1000 Lake Cook Road, Glencoe, IL 60022, 847-835-5440) in their Enabling Garden (<https://www.chicagobotanic.org/gardens/enabling>). It was found in their fact sheet on Vertical Gardening.

The succulent vertical garden is composed of commercial units specifically designed for this purpose. The Grovert living wall planters were given to us at a local Master Gardener plant sale, but check websites such as the following for purchase:

<http://verticalgardening.com/Item/brightgreengrovertbg8>. A local Master Gardener did the plant selection, planting and construction of this vertical garden. All of the plants are sedums and hen & chicks.

The three flower towers were made from cedar fence pickets and 1x2-inch cedar strips, purchased locally. Contact us for more information.

People have requested information on sources of some of the items in our projects in the garden. Here are materials from our 2016-2019 gardens:

- Twine tomato trellis materials including tomato clips: Farm Tek (<http://www.farmtek.com/>)
- 20-gallon fabric tomato pots called Smart Pots: Local retailers or Smart Pots (<https://smartpots.com/>)
- Haxnicks Micromesh cucumber screen for insect prevention: Territorial Seed Company (www.territorialseed.com/)
- Tomato ties on cages and/or arch were Adj-A-Tye Chain Lock: A.M. Leonard (<http://www.amleo.com/>) or Chainlock Reusable Locking Tie, Master Mark Plastics, Menards.
- Structural material for large tomato or bean arch, some cages, and ascending bean trellis was cattle panel fencing (16 feet long and 50 inches high, mostly with 6-in by 8-inch rectangles) from local Tractor Supply (<http://www.tractorsupply.com/>). One panel makes two triangular tomato cages about 2 by 2 by 2 feet. Some cages were 16 by 16 by 16 inches. The curved arch built in 2018 was composed of a single unit of cattle panel fencing (16 feet long and 50 inches high).
- Structure material for other tomato cages was concrete reinforcing mesh (an 8-foot long and 4-foot high sheet with 6-inch squares) from local building supply retailers. One sheet makes one triangular cage about 2.5 by 2 by 2 feet.
- Paper mulch was WeedGuard Plus Biodegradable Paper Weed Barrier (regular and heavyweight) from Gemplers (<http://www.gemplers.com/>).
- White fabric row cover material for insect protection is: Agribon+ AG-15 Row Cover (118" x 250') from Johnny's Selected Seeds (<http://www.johnnyseeds.com>).

- White fabric row cover (smaller sizes) for insect protection is Gardeneer by Dalen Harvest-Guard (5 by 25-foot sheet or 10 by 15-foot sheet depending on crop): Local retailers or Dalen (<https://www.dalenproducts.com/>).
- Black poly pipe and 2-foot long ½-inch rebar (or 9 gauge wire) for use with white fabric row cover: Local building supply and/or farm supply.
- Row cover hand pegs (used to hold down row covers) from Johnny's Selected Seeds (<http://www.johnnyseeds.com>).
- Hinges called Raised-Bed Grow-Box Corners for two 4 by 4 feet raised beds: Lee Valley Tools (<http://www.leevalley.com/>).
- Black Steel Raised Bed Corner Brackets for three raised beds: Plow & Hearth (<http://www.plowhearth.com/>); a similar product was also available locally at Lowe's in 2017-2018.
- Small metal raised bed kits were purchased locally from Menards (2017-2018).
- Sources of aquatic plants included Trickers (<http://www.tricker.com/>) and Lowe's.
- The two circular raised beds were built with tan 4 inch by 8 inch Dawson Retaining Wall Block purchased from Menards.
- The raised beds constructed in 2019 along the inside of the fence were made from 2 inch by 6 inch cedar lumber donated by Carter-Lee/ProBuild Indpls and Oldcastle Tan Brown Planter Wall Block (7.5 inch x 7.5 in. x 5.5 in.) purchased from The Home Depot.
