

- Include NOT MORE THAN 20 ITEMS (pieces). Roads, lanes, trees, light poles, fencerows, and a backdrop may be used to set off field or fields – but ARE NOT included in your maximum items count.
- Any combination of items may be used but:
  - Up to 1 structure (barn, building, house, shed, silo, etc)
  - Up to 8 animals
  - Up to 8 wheel toys (tractors, trucks, equipment, etc)
  - Up to 8 extras (feeders, people, bales, etc)
- The same farm toys or layout maybe used in more than one year but exhibits need to be changed, altered, or modified so as not to repeat the same exact exhibit.

Intermediate (Grades 6-8):

- Exhibit a farm scene display not to exceed 3’ wide X 2’ deep X 2’ high in size. – Outside dimensions. This includes any and all protection (Plexiglas, etc) that is used.
- Display must be built on rigid wood (i.e. plywood).
- Include NOT MORE THAN 40 ITEMS (pieces). Roads, lanes, trees, light poles, fencerows, and a backdrop may be used to set off field or fields – but ARE NOT included in your maximum items count.
- Any combination of items may be used but:
  - Not more than 3 structures (barn, building, house, shed, silo, etc)
  - Not more than 15 animals
  - Not more than 15 wheel toys (tractors, trucks, equipment, etc)
  - Not more than 15 extras (feeders, people, bales, etc)
- The same farm toys or layout maybe used in more than one year but exhibits need to be changed, altered, or modified so as not to repeat the same exact exhibit.

Advanced (Grades 9-12):

- Exhibit a farm scene display not to exceed 3’ wide X 2’ deep X 2’ high in size. – Outside dimensions. This includes any and all protection (Plexiglas, etc) that is used.
- Display must be built on rigid wood.
- This division is open to create any type of farm scene you want. Example: Farmstead (buildings, grain handling equipment, field work, harvesting), Farm Equipment Store, Auction, Historical Layout, Specialty Agriculture Layout, etc.
- Include a short report, not more than 1 page, about “Why you chose this layout”, include explanation of layout, reason for choosing it, what your favorite piece is and why.
- The same farm toys or layout maybe used in more than one year but exhibits need to be changed, altered, or modified so as not to repeat the same exact exhibit.



## Fine Arts

**Requirement for judging:**

- A 4-H-618A-W “4-H Craft Information Card” should be attached to the project for description of work completed on the project.
- If multiple pieces make up the exhibit, a photograph of the complete exhibit should be attached to the exhibit so

the total exhibit can properly be displayed.

- For safety purposes, any craft exhibit that resembles a sword, knife, or look-a-like weapon will be judged but will not be displayed.

**Level 1** Grades 3-5      **Level 2** Grades 6-8      **Level 3** Grades 9-12

1. No specific requirements are expected for painting and drawing, but the member is expected to improve skills each year.
2. Acceptable mediums are oil, charcoal, pastels, pencil, ink, acrylic or watercolor.
3. May be on canvas, canvas board or paper.
4. Each exhibit must be framed as a picture and prepared for hanging. Matting may be used to enhance the artwork but does not replace the frame.
5. Canvas art on a wooden frame is considered prepared for hanging provided that frame has a hanger.
6. 4-H member may exhibit no more than 2 projects of different mediums.
7. A portfolio may accompany exhibit for judging purposes to show experience and development of techniques. This portfolio will not be displayed and must be taken home after judging.

**Requirement for judging:**

- Gift Wrapping Tag

All packages are for exhibit only and are not to contain articles. Gifts are not required to be opened.

**Level 1 (Grades 3 – 5)**

Exhibit one wrapped box (rectangular or square) includes a self-made bow showing creativity. Attach completed card.

**Level 2 (Grades 6 – 8)**

Exhibit one wrapped cylinder shape showing creativity in materials chosen. Attached completed card.

**Level 3 (Grades 9 -12)**

Exhibit one package of any shape. You **MUST** design your own wrapping paper and accessories. No commercial gift wrapping supplies will be allowed. Judging will be based on creativity and neatness. Attach completed card.
