Requirements:

- Junior Leader Manual

Junior Leader Purpose:

1. To encourage the development of young adults.
2. To provide assistance to the local 4-H clubs and their adult leaders.
3. To assist in the leadership of the county 4-H activities and programs.

Eligibility: Any 4-H member who is in grades 7 -12 during the 2018 – 2019 calendar year, and completes at least one other 4-H project within another club.

Requirements for Completion:

1. Participate in at least one Junior Leader (JL) community service activity.
2. Participate in at least two Junior Leader leadership activities.
3. Complete two leadership or community service activities within your local club.
4. Attend at least four Junior Leader meetings.
5. Work at least two shifts in the pop stand during fair week, unless prior arrangements are made with leader .
6. Turn in your completed Junior Leader record book and calendar with your Record of Completion by the end of project pick up.

Expectations:

1. Each Junior Leader is expected to serve on at least one committee.
2. To be elected to an office, a previous year as a Junior Leader must have been completed.
3. Expectations by grade:
 - a. Grades 7-8: participate in 1 Junior Leader club leadership or service activity
 - b. Grades 9 -10: participate in 2 Junior Leader leadership or service activities and 1 county leadership or service activity.
 - c. Grades 11-12: 3 Junior Leader leadership or service activities and 2 county leadership or service activities.
