Level 1 Grades 3-5 **Level 2** Grades 6-8 **Level 3** Grades 9-12

1. No specific requirements are expected for painting and drawing, but the member is expected to improve skills each year.
2. Acceptable mediums are oil, charcoal, pastels, pencil, ink, acrylic or watercolor.
3. May be on canvas, canvas board or paper.
4. Each exhibit must be framed as a picture and prepared for hanging. Matting may be used to enhance the artwork but does not replace the frame.
5. Canvas art on a wooden frame is considered prepared for hanging provided that frame has a hanger.
6. 4-H member may exhibit no more than 2 projects of different mediums.
7. A portfolio may accompany exhibit for judging purposes to show experience and development of techniques. This portfolio will not be displayed and must be taken home after judging.



Gift Wrapping

Judging - Thursday, July 2, at 6pm in the Fairgrounds; Shrine Building.
Will be considered for State Fair with the Any Other Crafts Category

Requirement for judging:

- Gift Wrapping Tag

All packages are for exhibit only and are not to contain articles. Gifts are not required to be opened.

Level 1 (Grades 3 – 5)

Exhibit one wrapped box (rectangular or square) includes a self-made bow showing creativity. Attach completed card.

Level 2 (Grades 6 – 8)

Exhibit one wrapped cylinder shape showing creativity in materials chosen. Attached completed card.

Level 3 (Grades 9 -12)

Exhibit one package of any shape. You **MUST** design your own wrapping paper and accessories. No commercial gift wrapping supplies will be allowed. Judging will be based on creativity and neatness. Attach completed card.



Lego - Construction

Judging - Thursday, July 2, at 9am in the Fairgrounds; Shrine Building.
Will be considered for State Fair with the Any Other Crafts Category

Requirement for judging:

- If multiple pieces make up the exhibit, a photograph of the complete exhibit should be attached to the exhibit so the total exhibit can properly be displayed. For safety purposes any craft exhibit that resembles a sword, knife, or look-a-like weapon will be judged but will not be displayed.
- A base 2" larger than the Lego type building block board is required.

General Rules:

1. Member is permitted to use any type of building block, not just the brand name "Lego". However, blocks used must be Lego-type blocks.
2. Judging will be based on overall design, construction techniques, soundness, sturdiness, and balance.
3. Members are encouraged to use imagination and creativity in developing his/her exhibit.
4. This is a construction project, NOT a scene. The exhibit is to be a creation/object.
5. Blocks are not to be glued together or to the base. Tape, clay, or other adhesives are NOT to be used.
6. Exhibitors are NOT permitted to alter blocks in any way, including but not limited to cutting, breaking, filing, painting, or using markers, crayons, pencils, chalk, etc. on the blocks or Lego plates/bases.
7. All bases, if used in the construction, must be Lego-type building block boards. Cardboard, wood, or other non-building block materials can only be used as part of a display case intended to protect the exhibit during display. It will not be judged as part of the project.
8. All designs are to be original. Designs exhibited from a kit's instruction sheet will not be permitted.
 - (a) Parts from various kits/sets may be used.
 - (b) Items on the exhibit not to be used are wood, cloth, paper, etc.: unless from a Lego-type set such as sails from a pirate set.
 - (c) Labels, stickers, and/or decals may not be added to the exhibit
 - (d) Those labels or pictures which have been imprinted on the brick by the Lego/Lego-type clocks will be accepted.
9. People, animals, windows, doors, etc, may be used in the exhibit; they are not allowed to be glued to the base or to the blocks; and they do not count as moveable objects.
10. Attach to project – a postcard or page size description of work completed on the project. Please be sure to include your name.
11. We strongly recommend, but do not require, putting your project in a display case. This will help protect your exhibit during the fair.

Exhibit Requirements:

Level A (Grades 3-4)

1. Exhibit one character or object (For example: you may create an animal, person, statue, totem pole, etc.). Not to be building in level A are buildings, structures, and means of transportation (air, land, water, or space).
 - (a) The entire exhibit shall not exceed 12" long by 12" wide by 12" high.
 - (b) Exhibit shall not have any moving parts.
 - (c) Motorized parts are not permitted at this level.

Level B (Grades 5-6)

1. Exhibit a structure or means of transportation (i.e. building, car, plane, boat, farm equipment, train, tractor, etc.).
 - (a) The entire exhibit shall not exceed 18" long by 18" wide by 18" high, including fully extended parts.
 - (b) Exhibit may have moving parts; however it is not required.
 - (c) Motorized parts are not permitted at this level.

Level C (Grades 7-9)

1. Exhibit any two RELATED objects (i.e. windmill & house; tractor & barn; ship & airplane; or other building/vehicles with related objects).
 - (a) The entire exhibit shall not exceed 18" long by 18" wide by 24" high, including fully extended parts.

- (b) Exhibit must include at least one of the two objects have moveable parts.
- (c) Motorized parts are not permitted at this level.

Level D (Grades 10-12)

1. Exhibit a display of three or more RELATED objects (i.e. vehicle, structures, characters, etc.).
 - (a) Exhibit shall not exceed 24” long by 24” wide by 36” high, including fully extended parts.
 - (b) Exhibit must include at least one of the three objects to have moveable or motorized parts. See Rule #9 under “General Rules”.
 - (c) Electric lights may be used at this level.



Lego - Creative Scene

Judging - Thursday, July 2, at 9am in the Fairgrounds; Shrine Building.
Will be considered for State Fair with the Any Other Crafts Category

Requirement for judging:

- If multiple pieces make up the exhibit, a photograph of the complete exhibit should be attached to the exhibit so the total exhibit can properly be displayed. For safety purposes any craft exhibit that resembles a sword, knife, or look-a-like weapon will be judged but will not be displayed.
- A Styrofoam base 2” larger than the Lego type building block board is required.

General Rules:

3. Members are encouraged to use imagination and creativity in developing his/her exhibit.
