Model Craft

Judging - Thursday, July 2, at 6:00pm at the Fairgrounds; Shrine Building.

Will be considered for State Fair with the Any Other Crafts Category

Requirement for judging:

- If multiple pieces make up the exhibit, a photograph of the complete exhibit should be attached to the exhibit so the total exhibit can properly be displayed. For safety purposes any craft exhibit that resembles a sword, knife, or look-a-like weapon will be judged but will not be displayed.
- Exhibits must be a small scale replica and meet the following criteria:
 - Must be of injected styrene plastics
 - At least 25% of the exhibit must be painted
 - Wood, paper, clay, die-cast, or snap together models are not permitted
 - Screws are not permitted
 - Pre-painted or pre-decaled factory models are not permitted
 - Legos are not considered models and are to be exhibited as Any Other Craft
- If the model is being built from a kit, include a copy of the instructions with the craft information card.

Level A: Exhibits should be mounted on a piece of Styrofoam that extends no more than 1” on all sides of the model and that is approximately 1” thick.

Grade 3: Assemble a 1/24th or 1/25th scale plastic model car or truck kit. No die cast – pre-painted models. “Snap together” kits are NOT to be used. Use only the parts sold and furnished with the stock kit. Current store merchandising may mean you’ll have to buy a 3 in 1 or 2 in 1 kit. Assemble ONLY the stock version of the kit for 4-H exhibits. Windows are to be installed. Do not paint or add any decals to your model.

Grade 4: Assemble a 1/24th or 1/25th scale plastic model car or truck. “Snap together” kits are NOT to be used. Exhibit ONLY the stock version of the kit. Windows are to be installed. DO NOT paint the model, but DO apply decals.

Level B: Exhibits should be mounted on a piece of Styrofoam that extends no more than 1” on all sides of the model and that is approximately 1” thick.

Grade 5 Assemble a 1/24th or 1/25th scale plastic model car or truck. “Snap together” kits are NOT to be used.

Assemble ONLY the stock version of the kit. Windows are to be installed. The exterior of the model must be painted. The undercarriage is considered part of the exterior and must also be painted. Interior painting and decals are optional.

Grade 6 Assemble a 1/24th or 1/25th scale plastic model car or truck. "Snap together" kits are NOT to be used. You may use any version of your model kit. Windows must be installed. Entire models must be painted including interior and exterior, frame, engine, suspension, differential, etc. Decals are required.

Level C: Exhibits should be mounted on a piece of Styrofoam that extends no more than 1" on all sides of the model and that is approximately 1" thick.

Grade 7 Assemble a scale model of your choosing. Cars, trucks, boats, planes, ships, etc. are acceptable. All parts must be painted, including interior, exterior, frame, engine, suspension, differential, etc. Decals are required.

Grade 8 Assemble any plastic model card of your own choosing and own design. This is NOT to be a complete kit. For example: convert a model car into a radically different design, such as a model T or hot rod or a pick up to a dragster. You can combine pieces from several kits if you wish.

Grade 9 Assemble a model of your own choosing. Cars, trucks, boats, ships, planes, etc. are acceptable. The model is to be displayed on a diorama or layout which is not to exceed 24" x 24". Use your creativity to design a diorama which enhances your model. Both diorama and model will be judged as one item.

Level D: Grades 10 -12

Assemble 2 or more models from kits or their own design and choosing in any number of the following categories: trucks, farm tractors, semi tractors, cars, planes, ships or boats, and miscellaneous (all other models). These models may be of any scale, they may be motorized or not, however, all models will remain stationary. The entire exhibit will be judged as one item.



Needlecraft

Requirement for judging:

- If multiple pieces make up the exhibit, a photograph of the complete exhibit should be attached to the exhibit so the total exhibit can properly be displayed. For safety purposes any craft exhibit that resembles a sword, knife, or look-a-like weapon will be judged but will not be displayed.

Needlecrafts are those crafts which use a specific tool (needles and hooks) to create a particular effect unique to the tools and materials used. Such crafts include: (Hand work) Knitting, embroidery, crocheting, needlepoint, crewel, candlewicking, chicken scratching, hand quilting, tatting, huck embroidery, hemstitching; also pulled, drawn and counted thread work and punch needle work. Does not include latch hook, plastic canvas, machine knitting, machine quilting, or arm knitting/crocheting.

All exhibited articles must be ready for use. (Pictures – framed and ready for hanging.)
