



INDIANA 4-H DOG PROJECT- COUNTY FAIR OPTIONS

Oral presentation, Can be presented in person (late summer/ fall events) or filmed (virtual fair).

Dogs may not be used for in-person presentations.

- Subject for the presentation can be any topic related to the 4-H Dog program. Content must follow published rules and regulations.

- Visual Aids - Must be provided by the 4-H member.

- Appearance - Attire must conform to published 4-H Dog rules and regulations.

- Time:

Junior (grades 3-5) --- 2-4 min

Intermediate (grades 6-8) --- 3-5 min

Senior (grades 9-12) --- 4-6 min

Video of an obedience routine

- Perform the exercises from the obedience level in which you were enrolled last year (or a higher level if you prefer).

- A judge stand-in is not required to call commands.

- Exam for the Sit for Examination or Stand for Examination may be performed by 4-H Member.

- Video may be one continuous shot with all exercises or individual exercise clips.

Written Summary of an Obedience Exercise (you taught or improved)

(may be accompanied by one or more photos, or a video)

Summary should include the following information:

- Copy of the description of the exercise you taught or improved from the 4-H Dog Obedience Guide.

- How did you plan to teach/improve the exercise?

- Did you have to revise plans?

- Where has your dog performed the new or improved exercise?

- How long did the teaching process take?
