Grades 3 through 5:

- ◆ Poster Only – Showing what you learning in 4-H Shooting Sports

Grades 6 through 8 (Choose one):

- ◆ Poster
- ◆ Small project or model no larger than 18 x 18 x 36 inches.
- ◆ Notebook, showing how a shooting sports item was made, or project completed. Include pictures of the item or project.

Note: Exhibits **MUST** meet the size restrictions or be presented in a notebook. All exhibits, other than posters, must include an explanation of costs (time and money) and procedures.

Grades 9 through 12 (Choose one):

- ◆ Poster
- ◆ Project or model (any size) and explanation of costs and procedure.
- ◆ Notebook, showing how a shooting sports item was made, or project completed. Include picture of the item or project and explanation of costs and procedures.

Note: All exhibits, other than posters, must include an explanation of costs (time and money) and procedures (your research, planning, and how you will use the finished product).

Archery – Safety, How to Shoot a Bow

SHOOT A BOW

BOW SHOOTING SAFETY

1. Release an arrow only when the path is clear and beyond the mark.
2. Make sure the bow is pointing forward the arrow is not fully drawn over the bowline.
3. Avoid shooting in the general direction of another person, unless you can be observed.
4. Do not shoot straight up. A falling arrow can penetrate the target shield.
5. Carry arrows in the weakest position or in a holder when carrying a quiver.
6. Never touch the arrow or fletch or bare when someone is in front of you.
7. Never touch the arrow to your face and never touch the arrow to your clothes.
8. All bows are under tension.

1. The proper shooting posture is to stand at a right angle to the target with your feet shoulder width apart. The feet should point forward for control. Keep arrows pointed down in case of an arrow release.

2. Grip the arrow shaft on the lower arrow rest.

3. With the arrow between the thumb and index fingers of the right hand keep the arrow pointed down. Make sure you are back number in pointing to not face place the rest of arrow into the arrow pocket in bow. Then pull arrow all the way.

4. Pull string back as string is facing the center of your mouth, which is called anchor point. Make sure right index is straight back from center of your mouth. Left arm should be held straight out.

5. Place third finger around arrow. One finger above and two below arrow to and can place all three fingers under arrow.

6. Right hand is on the bow. Draw the bow up to your eye. Look up with target by using right eye bow.

7. Release arrow by letting go of string completely. The arrow
