Smallmouth

Bass

HABITAT: Adult smallmouth bass live in shallow rocky areas of lakes and in the clear and gravel bottom runs and flowing pools of rivers. They also live in cool flowing streams and reservoirs fed by these types of streams.

SIZE: The length of smallmouth bass most commonly caught is between 12 and 16 in (30.5 cm to 40.6 cm). The maximum recorded length for a smallmouth bass is 27.2 in (69 cm). Generally, male smallmouth bass are smaller than female smallmouth bass.

RANGE: The range of smallmouth bass in North America includes the St. Lawrence basin to the Great Lakes system and Hudson Bay. Their range extends from southern Quebec in Canada to North Dakota and south to northern Oklahoma and eastern Oklahoma within the U.S. They are also present in the drainage of the Mississippi river basin. Smallmouth bass have also been introduced into England, France, Japan, Korea and Latin Africa.



It normally takes three to five years of growth before smallmouth bass are legally harvestable in states that have a minimum recreational size limit of 12 inches. The oldest reported age for smallmouth bass is 20 years. The heaviest reported weight for a smallmouth bass is 5.4 kg (11 lbs, 15 oz.)

Anglers wade fishing in rivers generally cast upstream and then work the lure or bait with the current. As it passes parallel to them, it will then swing back towards them in the current. Fish will often hit at this point. This is very efficient and effective as the bait or lure is moving naturally with the water flow. Also, anglers can thoroughly work high percentage areas slowly and methodically.

DIET: Young smallmouth bass feed on plankton and immature aquatic insects. Smallmouth bass are also known to be cannibalistic. Adult smallmouth bass may feed on crayfish, fish and aquatic and terrestrial insects. Nest just like their largemouth cousins in the shallow waters of lakes and rivers on sand, gravel, or rocky bottoms. Nest building occurs within 150 yards of where the male smallmouth bass built his nest the previous

Smallmouth bass are a popular recreational species in the United States. State fish and wildlife agencies manage smallmouth bass by conserving and protecting smallmouth.
