

Animal Posters

All exhibits must be displayed horizontally, sized 22" x 28" foam-core board or posterboard mounted on a firm backing, and covered in clear plastic or other transparent material. Be sure to include the project label in the lower right-hand corner.

All posters, notebooks, and display boards **must** include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.

Exhibit Requirements:

For All Levels: Exhibit a poster on any topic related to the species of animal chosen.

Suggestions for posters include, but are not limited to:

- Diseases
- Breeds
- Colors
- Uses of that type of Animal
- You & Your Animal
- Caring for the Animal
- Body Language.
- History of the Animal or Breed
- Careers involving a specific animal
- Body Parts
- Why the animal would/would not make a good pet

Notes:

- Topics should not be repeated in the same species.
- More than one species can be exhibited within the same year.
- A General Record Sheet should be filled out and placed in your Green Record Book for each species you exhibit.
- For judging purposes posters will be classified into 2 categories:
 - Small Animal – Cat, Dog, Lama, Poultry and Rabbits
 - Large Animal – Beef, Dairy, Goats, Horse & Pony, Sheep and Swine
- A Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be awarded for each Large and Small Animals Posters.
- Champion and Reserve Champions will be given for each specie.
- Only the following species have State Fair Entries:
 - Cat
 - Dog
 - Lama
 - Rabbit
 - Poultry
